Prenatal and Infant Health

Community

- Birth weight
- Entry into prenatal care
- Infant mortality
- Smoking, drinking, drug use during pregnancy

Program

- Participation in pre- and post natal care
- Reduction in smoking, alcohol and drug use
- Reduction in low birth weight births
- Primary source of infant care

Healthy Child Development

Community

- On time immunizations

Program

- Health insurance enrollment
- Timely medical and dental check-ups
- Child health problems identification and referral
- Immunization rates

Healthy Youth Development

Community

- Births to adolescents
- Juvenile delinquency petitions
- Homicides, suicides and accidental deaths

Healthy Development and Healthcare Services for Children

- Children and families receiving medical, dental, and mental health care
- Children and families with insurance coverage
- Immunization rate
- Prenatal care/healthy birth

Positive Child Development

- Parenting confidence in knowledge and skills

Healthy Child Development

Children Ready for School

- Screening, detection and response to developmental delays
- Parental involvement in family-child language and literacy activities
- Rate of participation in pre-school programs
- Children development (on standardized developmental screen) at the age of school entry
- Child language and literacy skills

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FSSR Outcomes & Indicators

Program

- Decrease in smoking, alcohol and drug use
- Reduction in teen pregnancy – 2nd birth
- Increased youth involvement in pro-social activities
- Youth connections with positive role models
- Reduction in recidivism to juvenile court
